## ZOOM EXPECTATIONS, HERE AND THERE

Zoom is a really amazing tool for students to be able to contact their teachers in a productive venue to ensure that we can get to all the students and get all the students to show growth! Teachers have set up Zoom expectations, the same way that they would set up classroom expectations. To reiterate some whole school expectations:

- Students cannot be in a bed. We want devices on a hard surface (table, desk, etc.) and them sitting on a chair.
- Students MUST have their cameras on. This is non-negotiable.
- Students MUST be working on the assignment at hand, not gaming, playing music, etc, because that becomes distracting to your student and distracting to others.
- Students MUST attend all sessions set up by your child's teacher. If you have a problem getting on, contact the teacher. This is used for attendance. Not attending in the afternoon will result in a 1/2 day absence.
- Students are expected to participate, in particular when called upon.
